



Horseback Ethnography and Multispecies Intersectionality

Feminist and multispecies anthropologies have de-centred those most visible, in order to appreciate the perspectives of those othered in society –but also in order to better understand society at large. This paper goes beyond de-centring the human towards de-centring another analytical focus: the species dyad. Building on previous work on gender-species intersectionality and drawing on five fieldworks of multispecies ethnography involving gendered relations between humans, cattle and horses on three continents, this paper offers a conceptualization of the multispecies triad by outlining a multispecies intersectionality theory.
